

Seeking a Second Opinion

The fertility journey can be daunting and confusing, so it can be difficult to know when you should consider seeking a second opinion. Approximately 30% of our patients have begun treatment elsewhere and come to us for a second opinion before switching clinics to Demeter completely.

When should you consider seeking a second opinion at Demeter?

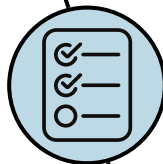
- If you have normal fertility parameters and have had 3 unsuccessful cycles
- If you fall into the 'complex' case segment and have only been offered general treatment regimes (Low AMH, recurrent implantation failure or over 40 years old)
- If you have not been offered comprehensive whole-body or genetic testing
- A same-sex couple and have experienced limited donor options or extended treatment times (over 4-6 weeks)

If you fit into any of these categories we recommend reaching out to us, if you don't fit into these but would like to know more please still contact us. There is no one size fits all answer to fertility treatment or second opinions.

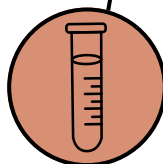
Medical History

Provide your medical history and any recent blood results prior to your appointment (anything over 6-12 months old will not provide us with any useful information).

Tests and follow up

Demeter doctors often ask you to undergo blood tests that other clinics don't consider or offer. A follow up appt is essential to discuss these results and new information.
